Dear parents/carers,

Alhamdu Lillah, we have had an overall successful period for the beginning of this year. We would like to thank all the parents in particular for their support in responding to the Covid-19 government guidance for symptoms. The students have also been excellent despite the really difficult situation and may Allah (swt) bless you all for your efforts.

Covid-19

There have been no positive cases so far and we will contact the local public health body for further guidance if and when that happens. In that scenario, we will quickly contact everyone it may impact.

We would like to remind everyone with the procedure if a student is feeling unwell and displays any Covid 19 symptoms. In line with Government guidance which we have personalised in our risk assessment according to Jamia's specific situation, we will be in close contact with parents with any concerns. The symptoms we look out for are;

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

The current steps that we take are;

- Contact parent to collect student from school (please cooperate and treat as emergency situation. Please arrange transport as soon as possible to collect the student)
- Book a test / use home test kit
- Isolate for 10 days or according to latest Government guidance in the case of positive result
- Return to Jamia after isolation or in the case of a negative test result.


Nottingham Lockdown
