Dear parents/carers,

We hope you are in the best of health and Iman. We would like to thank you for your cooperation and support through these difficult times. May Allah (swt) protect us all and enable us to continue together in this journey of sacred knowledge.

March 2021 Return

- We will, In Shaa Allah (swt), continue to teach remotely through Zoom from the 8th of March 2021 to the 11th of March 2021.
- The students will have the 12th and 13th of March off so as to prepare for their return to Jamia. Teachers will have inset on Friday the 12th March. We have scheduled an hour meeting during the day for the Covid risk assessment. And the rest of day to be used for planning and preparation for lessons.
- All boarding students will return in bubbles on the 14th March. A letter will be sent out about the requirements for the day as usual.
- Face to face learning for all students will begin on the 15th of March 2021.
- The term will finish on the 10th April of 2021. Students will be allowed to go home on that day.
- From the 12th to 30th of April teaching will continue over Zoom.
- The Ramadan timetable will differ to normal day timetable and will be sent closer to the time.
- The holidays will then begin from the 1st of May for Ramadan and Eid. Students will return to Jamia as usual for the 16th of May 2021.
- A letter will be sent to you about the required testing for Covid 19. Please do not attend Jamia if you have any symptoms of Corona.
- Students must remember to bring plastic plates, masks and wipes for daily use.

Foreign Students

Students who come from outside of the UK are most welcome to join and arrive in Jamia as normal with the rest of students In Shaa Allah. However, if there is extreme difficulty, we will be providing work on the Google classroom and hopefully online arrangements for them to attend lessons.
